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INT. THE THOMAS KITCHEN - DAY

MATTHEW THOMAS, a young boy of 14 years old, is standing at his kitchen counter, doggedly making sandwiches and putting them into a bag. His sister DEIDRE THOMAS, age 9, skips into the kitchen and stops short, looking at Matthew. Matthew continues to make the sandwiches. In the background, unbeknownst to the children, their mother, SAMANTHA THOMAS, observes them quietly from around a corner.

DEIDRE

What are you doing?

MATTHEW

What does it look like? Fixing sandwiches.

DEIDRE

Can I have one?

Matthew looks at her pointedly, and Deidre looks down shyly, for a moment.

MATTHEW

Did you mean --

DEIDRE

Sorry.

MAY I have a sandwich?

MATTHEW

Maybe.

They're for a friend.

DEIDRE

A friend?

Are you taking them to the playground?

MATTHEW

No.

You don't know them.
It's another friend.
They're for someone who needs them.

DEIDRE

Can I help?

Matthew looks at her brightly, as he puts the sandwiches in a bag.

MATTHEW

Sure.

You grab the bag.

DEIDRE

Can they -- I meant, may they have some soda?
Sandwiches make you thirsty.

MATTHEW

Good idea. Put four of them in the bag.

I just have to run back to my room for something.

Matthew runs back into his room, while Deidre puts the sandwiches and sodas in a bag. Matthew runs back into the kitchen. A knock is heard at the door, and Matthew goes to answer it. SAMANTHA DAVIS, a girl of 13, and her brother, DANIEL DAVIS stand at the door and Matthew greets them warmly. All the children walk into the kitchen.

DEIDRE

Hi.

Samantha looks around suspiciously at Deidre packing sandwiches and sodas in a bag.

SAMANTHA

Hey -- what's going on?
We thought you'd want to go to the park with us.

DANIEL

Yeah, what's with all the food?

DEIDRE

Matthew's helping people.

DANIEL

With sandwiches? Well, help me first!

Daniel tries to grab a sandwich, and Deidre slaps his hand away playfully. Samantha pulls Daniel away from the counter and silently mouths to him "Stop it."

MATTHEW

(Shrugs)

Yeah. Some new friends of mine. They need these.

Samantha and Daniel look at each other and then back at Matthew and DEIDRE.

SAMANTHA

You really don't have enough sandwiches.

DANIEL

Yeah... I get hungry after three.

SAMANTHA

(With a bit of snark)
YOU get hungry ALL the time.

Daniel sticks his tongue out at her, and Samantha, Deidre and Matthew laugh.

SAMANTHA (CONT'D)

We want to help.

Come on, let's make some more.

Matthew, Deidre, Samantha and Daniel form an assembly line and begin to make more sandwiches together, laughing and talking together, with Deidre putting them in a bag when completed. When they are finished, they all turn and look at each other.

MATTHEW

You ready?

DEIDRE

Yeah. But who are we going to see?

MATTHEW

You know how Mom always tells us we have to help others?
We're going to help somebody.

DEIDRE

Help somebody? Can we take Mom?

MATTHEW

Let's keep it a secret for now. Can you keep a secret?

DEIDRE

I can keep a secret.

SAMANTHA

Can we go too?

DANIEL

We won't tell.

We can keep a secret.

MATTHEW

(Gestures to Deidre)

Well, SHE can't.

Matthew look at her disdainfully for a minute, and starts to walk out with the bags. Deidre follows him out.

DEIDRE

(Petulantly)

Can!

I CAN keep a secret!

After Matthew, Samantha, Daniel and Deidre leave the house, DIANE THOMAS, a woman in her early 30s, walks into the kitchen, cleaning up after them. She smiles, looks up briefly and closes her eyes as if in a brief payer. Then she shakes her head and continues cleaning up the kitchen quickly. She then picks up her purse, grabs her car keys and leaves in the opposite direction.

EXT. ON THE SIDEWALK OUTSIDE THE HOME - DAY

MATTHEW THOMAS, DEIDRE THOMAS, SAMANTHA DAVIS and DANIEL DAVIS run across the Thomas house front yard, laughing and shouting at on another. They stop short when they see DIANE THOMAS in the car at the corner. They then walk slowly to the car, and DIANE rolls the window down. MATTHEW sticks his head inside the window.

DIANE

Need a ride?

DIANE smiles and motions them inside

DIANE (CONT'D)

Get in.

MATTHEW

Yes ma'am.

MATTHEW, DEIDRE, SAMANTHA and DANIEL get into the car.

EXT. ON THE SIDEWALK ON A BUSY STREET CORNER - DAY

An older man and woman, SAMUEL and DENISE JOHNSON sit huddled together, with backpacks and other possessions around then on the sidewalk. Another couple, SHARON BELL, a woman in her early 30s and her husband, DAVID BELL, a man also in his early 30s, are sitting beside them, and they are engaged in conversation.

Sharon grabs a tambourine from her possessions, smiles, and begins to tap it rhythmically, humming slowly to herself. DAVID joins in, creating a harmony. Then stops suddenly.

SHARON

Any requests?

SAMUEL

Whatever lifts your spirit.

DENISE

Wait... there's something I remember... from when I was little.

DAVID

(Chuckles)

Be careful... she's knows every song in the book.

Sharon throws him a look and Sharon and David chuckle together.

DAVID (CONT'D)

Hey, how about...?

SHARON

I know the one.

Sharon and David break in to a spontaneous harmony of "This Little Light Of Mine." Denise and Samuel begin to clap and sway with them in rhythm, laughing.

MATTHEW runs up to them eagerly, and DEIDRE, SAMANTHA and DANIEL follow behind, shyly.

MATTHEW

(Running up shouting)

SAMMY!

Hey, Sammy!

SAMUEL

(Smiles broadly and shakes Matthew's hand)

Hey there, young man! Good to see you again. So, what's the word?

MATTHEW

(Proudly presenting the bag)

The word for today... sandwiches.

Matthew extends the bags to Samuel and Denise, who take it gratefully, murmuring words of thanks.

DEIDRE

(Chirps up excitedly)

And soda!

Samuel, Denise, Sharon and David chuckle softly.

SAMUEL

Well, thank you, young lady. And who might you be?

MATTHEW

This is my sister, Deidre. She wanted to help.

(Motions to SAMANTHA and DANIEL)

And these are my friends, Sam and Daniel.

DANIEL

We helped, too!

Samantha nudges him.

SAMUEL

(Chuckles)

Well, I'm a Sam, too, young lady. Great to meet you all.

SAMANTHA and DANIEL both laugh shyly.

DENISE

And we thank you all. God bless you.

Matthew, Samantha, Daniel and DEIDRE murmur "Thank you, ma'am" to Denise.

SAMUEL

You know, young man, this is wonderful, and I thank you. Since you all brought something for us, I'm going to give you something in return.

(Chuckles)

SAMUEL

Looks like you made enough here for an army.

MATTHEW

(Shyly)

I thought maybe we could all share... you know... maybe... eat together?

DEIDRE

(Claps her hands

excitedly)

Like a picnic!

Like we do after Sunday school!

SAMANTHA

Sounds better than playing in the park.

SHARON

(Laughs)

Best offer I've had all day.

DAVID looks at her, laughing softly, and wraps an arm around her, hugging her briefly and kisses Sharon on her forehead.
